Almon Marion Sebolt a caring and loving, husband, father, grandfather, and brother, of Charlotte, died Thursday, March, 18, 2021. Almon, 81, was born May 21, 1939, on the family farm in Partello, MI, the son of Almon Sr. and Lucille (Shepard) Sebolt. On October 5, 1957, Almon married Joann Hamilton and together created their legacy of 62 years together. Almon was a man that was always on the move and loved working. Following graduating from high school Almon started working for General Motors. He started as a line worker and retired as a Foreman after 30 years. When he wasn't working Almon enjoyed watching country westerns, mowing his lawn, cooking, playing guitar, listening to country and gospel music, and also taking car rides with his wife Joann.
