Danny Lee Parker, 71, of Charlotte, died Friday, December 14, 2018 in Lansing, after a brief illness. Danny was born December 11, 1947 in Charlotte, the son of Charles and Maybell (Myers) Parker. He graduated from Charlotte High School before enlisting in the U.S. Army and proudly serving during the Vietnam War. Upon his return he worked 25 years for A.E.
