Bernard "Ben" Louis Siniarski, 86, of Charlotte, formerly of Laingsburg, died peacefully with his family by his side on Monday, November 10, 2025. Ben was born February 5, 1939, in Detroit, the son of Sigmund and Mary (Borkowski) Siniarski. He graduated high school in 1957 before enlisting in the U.S. Marine Corps. Upon his return from the service, he earned his bachelor's degree from Lawrence Tech in Southfield, MI.
