June 6, 1935 - February 10, 2015

Daniel Leroy Laudenslager, 79, of Charlotte, died Tuesday, February 10, 2015. Dan was born June 6, 1935 in Monroe, MI, the son of Ralph Raymond and Ruby M. (McGowen) Laudenslager. He served in the Vietnam War before returning home to Michigan, where he met Dorothy Aldrich of Lansing. The two married in 1967 and settled in Charlotte. Dan worked as a furnace tender for Owens-Illinois in Charlotte for nearly 30 years. He was a member of VFW Post 2406. He loved to “tinker,” and could fix almost anything.
