

Harry Norman Schmidt

May 23, 1929 - November 30, 2017

Harry Norman Schmidt, 88, of Charlotte, died Thursday, November 30, 2017. Harry was born May 23, 1929, in Carnegie, PA, the son of Herman and Sarah (Mulin) Schmidt. He graduated from Carnegie High School in 1947 before proudly serving in the U.S. Marine Corps aboard the USS Rochester in the Yellow Sea during the Korean Conflict. Harry moved to Charlotte in 1956 and started his family. He worked 30 years for the City of Charlotte, retiring as Public Works Foreman in 1989. Harry was a former post Commander of Charlotte VFW Post 2406, a member of the Marine Corps League in Lansing, and was a devoted member and volunteer of the Eaton Area Senior Center. Above all, Harry loved his family.

He is survived by his wife, Nellie Margaret Schmidt; children, Harry E. Schmidt, Steve (Maureen) Sparks, Shannon (Kevin) Cooksley, Greg (Jeannie) Sparks, Kelly (Karen) Sparks, Carol (Robert) Horness, Conni (Douglas) Artin, Cindy (J.J.) Jackson, and David (Paulette) Weisenberg; 22 grandchildren; 25 great-grandchildren; 9 great-great-grandchildren; sister, Katherine Sullivan; brother, Ralph Schmidt; and several nieces and nephews.
