Jimmie Louis Mitchell died peacefully following a lengthy illness at Eaton Community Palliative Care in Charlotte on April 4th, 2012 at the age of 81. Jimmie was born August 1st, 1930 to his parents Lee and Adell (Parham) Mitchell in Greenfield, Tennessee. He joined the United States Air Force in 1951 and served his country during the Korean War, being honorably discharged in 1953 holding the rank of Sergeant. Jimmie went to work for Motor Wheel in Lansing, worked 34 years, and retired in 1982. After retirement, he became a partner in Wofford's Grocery Store with his brother Willard Mitchell in Springville, Tennessee.
