Lyndon "Lee" Neil Dexter, 73, of Charlotte, passed away on May 11, 2016 at Eaton Community Palliative Care. Lee was born on January 19, 1943, in Lansing, MI, the son of Leonard and Beatrice (Covell) Dexter. He graduated from Lake Odessa High school before serving in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War. Lee worked for General Motors, retiring in 1993. Following retirement, he continued to drive truck and work as the "maintenance man" at CB's Bar in Charlotte. He was past District 8 Commander of the VFW, life member of the VFW and the Eagles, as well as a member of the American Legion. Lee was an avid golfer and also loved shooting pool. He enjoyed riding motorcycles, especially the 4,000+ mile trip with his wife Nancy out west. Above all, Lee loved his family, especially spending time with his granddaughter.
