November 30, 1921 - October 8, 2015

Margaret Louise Latchaw, 93, of Charlotte, MI, died October 8, 2015. Margaret entered this world on November 30, 1921, in Van Buren, Grant County, Indiana, the daughter of Walter and Cleopatra (Arnett) Pattison. She married Dale Latchaw on June 14, 1941, and together they had four children. Margaret was the first female Deputy Sheriff in the State of Michigan, serving from 1957-1958. She then worked at the Eaton County Coop Extension Service as a secretary, and after her retirement, went to work in the family lighting business, Latchaw Enterprises in Charlotte. Many will remember Margaret as a compassionate, kind and loving mother, grandmother and friend. Above all, she loved her family.

Margaret is survived by her daughter Nancy Wells; sons, Stephen (Mary) Latchaw, Roger (Rosemary) Latchaw, and Martin (Sue) Latchaw; 8 grandchildren; 19 great-grandchildren; 7 great-great grandchildren; sisters, Garadene Clem of Elyria, OH and Annabel (Robert) Mathioudakis of Indianapolis; and brother-in-law, Rex Hughes of Jonesboro, IN. She was predeceased by her husband Bernard Dale Latchaw in 1990; brother, Edward Pattison; sister, Betty Hughes; and son-in-law, Phil Wells.
