Norman Ralph Ladd, 77, of Charlotte, died peacefully on Monday, July 22, 2019 in Charlotte. Norm was born August 28, 1941, the son of J. Robert and Marjory Elaine (Newth) Ladd. He graduated from Charlotte High School in 1959 before serving in the U.S. Marine Corps in Okinawa, Japan until 1964. Upon his return, Norm worked in maintenance at Olivet Schools, then Charlotte Public Schools for over 20 years. Following his retirement, Norm enjoyed movies, and taking care of his mother. In his early years, he snorkeled the Great Barrier Reef, and completed over 20 white water trips in the Grand Canyon.

Norm is survived by his nieces and nephews; Roger Ladd, Jr., Beth Wengert, Lori Root, and Mark Broskey. He was predeceased by his parents and his brother, Roger Ladd.
