Robert E. Mohre, 88, of Charlotte, passed away Wednesday, February 17, 2016 in Charlotte. He was born January 22, 1928 in Charlotte, MI, the son of Glenn and Laura (Long) Mohre. He graduated from Charlotte High School in 1947 and received a B.A. from Alma College in 1952. Bob married Joanne Willard on June 9, 1951. Many remember Bob as a beloved coach and teacher with Charlotte Public Schools, as well as his early careers in Vestaburg and Fowlerville.

Bob is survived by his children Terry, Timothy (Nancy), David (Trudy), and Cynthia (Lyle) Robinette. He was very close with his grandchildren, Glenn, Gaylen, Kristi, Ashley, Madeline, Jase and Brittany; and great grandchildren Harvey, Lucy, Gibson, Vivian, Weston, Palmer and Quinn. He is predeceased by his wife, Joanne, on December 4, 2015; his sister, Grace Morey; and his brother, Ray Mohre.
