Sharon Gail Anderson, 75, of Charlotte died peacefully on Tuesday, December 13 at Eaton Community Palliative Care. She was born March 3, 1941 in Lansing to Carl and Virginia (Ruggles) Clark. Sharon was a loving mother and grandmother, with her life made very rich by caring for her family. 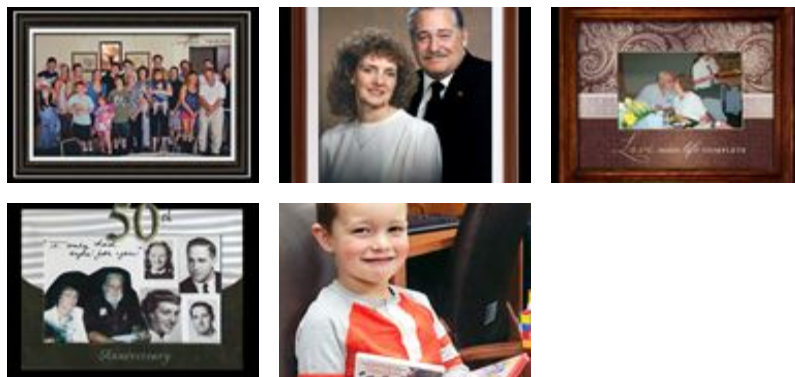
