Terry Lee Robison, 67, of Charlotte, died Thursday, September 24, 2015.

Terry was born September 4, 1948 in Lansing, MI, the son of Marion Winfield and Edna Opal (Hartman) Robison. He graduated from Lansing Everett High School in 1966 and later earned his Associate Degree in drafting. He worked 30 years for the Board of Water and Light and served 20 years in the National Guard. He and his wife, Mary, were very active in the Moose Lodge and FOE Aerie 1039 in Lansing. Terry was also a member of the American Legion. He loved the Detroit Lions and Westerns and was a huge fan of U of M and NASCAR.
